# Food Pantry

the Revealer, Lawgiver, and Redeemer.

In the early days, Christians were accustomed to solemnize the anniversary of a martyr's death for Christ at the place of martyrdom. In the 4th century, neighboring dioceses began to interchange feasts, to transfer relics, to divide them, and to join in a common feast. Frequently groups of martyrs suffered on the same day, which naturally led to a joint commemoration.

In the persecution of Diocletian the number of martyrs became so great that a separate day could not be assigned to each. The Church, however, feeling that every martyr should be venerated, appointed a common day for all. The first trace of this we find in Antioch on the Sunday after Pentecost. We also find mention of a common day in a sermon of St. Ephrem the Syrian (373), and in the 74th homily of St. John Chrysostom (407).

In the West, Boniface IV, on May 13, 609, or 610, consecrated the Pantheon in Rome to the Blessed Virgin and all the martyrs, ordering an anniversary. Gregory III (731-741) consecrated a chapel in the Basilica of St. Peter to all the saints and fixed the anniversary for the first of November. This date of November 1 became the date of commemorating "All Saints" in the Roman Church (and subsequently as well as in the Anglican and some Lutheran traditions).

The Byzantine Catholic and Orthodox Churches, however, retain the traditional date of commemoration.

■ *Also Commemorated* — Also commemorated on this date, May 27, is St.Therapont, Priest-Martyr, who died for the Faith A.D. 259 in the reign of Emperor Valerian.

■ The Apostles Fast — The Apostles Fast begins tomorrow, the first day following the Sunday of All Saints and concludes on the eve of the Feast of the Prime Apostles, Peter and Paul. A fasting period of variable length, in 2018 the fast is observed from May 28 through June 28.

Observance of the fast is voluntary, but all Fridays during this period remain days of penance (abstinence from meat products). The Feast of Peter and Paul, a day of precept (obligation) for the Byzantine Church, falls annually on June 29.

- Orientale Lumen Conference The 2018 Orientale Lumen Conference — an ecumenical dialogue between the Orthodox and Catholic Churches — is titled Sister Churches: Fact or Fiction? and will be held from June 18–21 at the Washington Retreat House in D.C. Visit www.olfoundation.org to register.
- Master of Arts Program This fall 2018, the Byzantine Catholic Seminary is making available its Master of Arts in Theology degree program with fully online courses. These classes are consistent with those offered on campus and utilize many of our in-house faculty.

In keeping with our mission statement, "... teaching them to observe all things that I have commanded you" (*Mt. 28:20*), Byzantine Online seeks to produce exceptional academic leaders in Eastern Christian theology, scripture and dogma. A new chaplaincy focus has been added as well.
