- Today's Commemorations Today in the Byzantine Church is the Tenth Sunday after Pentecost. On this date, July 29, the Byzantine Church commemorates St. Callinicus, martyr at Gangrae about A.D. 290; and SS. Sarafina, virgin-martyr, and Theodotia and her Children.
- Correction: Prayerful Condolences Our Mission Community extends its prayers and sympathy to Steve Krempasky upon the recent passing of his grandmother, not his grandfather. May her memory be eternal. Vičnaja jej pamjať.
- *Dormition:* Fast The fourth of four fasting periods during the liturgical year of the Byzantine Church begins Wednesday, August 1. The Dormition Fast is observed each year from August 1 to 14, the eve of the Feast of the Dormition (Falling Asleep) of the Theotokos. [Note: The Feast of the Dormition is referred to as the Feast of the Assumption in the Latin (Roman) Church.]

Traditionally, the Dormition Fast is a fast from meat and dairy products on Mondays through Fridays with a mitigation on Saturdays, Sundays, and on the Feast of the Transfiguration (August 6). In the United States, the Byzantine Ruthenian Church leaves to the individual how much of the fast he/she observes.

The Mother of God was without sin. Therefore, she was always prepared during her life on earth for the journey to eternal life in heaven. Through a life of prayer and fasting she was prepared always to meet

■ *Uniontown 'Otpust'* — The 84th Annual Pilgrimage (*otpust*) in honor of Our Lady of Perpetual Help will be held September 1 & 2. This year's theme will be "Mary, Hope of All Generations."
