- Today's Commemoration Today in the Byzantine Church is the Commemoration of the Second Coming of Jesus Christ as Judge, also called Meatfare Sunday because traditionally no meat products were consumed until Pascha. It is the fourth of the five pre-lenten Sundays leading up to the Great Fast.

In today's Gospel lesson, Jesus describes in detail the Terrible Judgment. His simple words raised to the divine sphere the most delicate acts of human kindness. Early philosophers branded compassion and mercy as weaknesses, but in reality they are the signs of a nobility of heart.

Christ has taught us that all those who are filled with love for Him should realize that whatever they do for the poor and the afflicted is done for Him. For a slice of bread and for a glass of water given in His name, our Lord promises heaven.

In describing the Last Judgment, we are led to hope for mercy if we have been charitable to our neighbors. We must realize that our Lord is merciful in the highest degree, but He is also just.

- Abstinence As each Sunday is a celebration of our Lord's Resurrection, each Friday is a commemoration of Holy and Great Friday and is observed with penance. One may abstain from meat or instead offer prayer or charitable works as our penance.
- Great Fast Begins The first full day of the Great Fast is Monday, March 4. At the close of Divine Liturgy on next Sunday, March 3 (Cheesefare Sunday), we will pray the Rite of Forgiveness, during which we ask for forgiveness from one another. Cheesefare Sunday is also known as Forgiveness Sunday.
- *All Souls Hramoty* There are five All Souls Saturdays during the liturgical year of the Byzantine Church during which we pray the Divine Liturgy and remember our faithful department by name. The first All Souls Saturday this year was yesterday, February 23. If you wish to add any names to the list of persons remembered in your family, known as "diptychs" or "hramoty," please use the appropriate envelop in your offertory envelope box. Place the envelope in the Sunday collection with the list of names you wish to add with your offering for their remembrance. It is also permissible to simply list "all the departed of the "(your family name)" rather than each person by name. If you wish to update, delete, or add new names, please contact the Parish Office at 703-573-3986 during office hours, 10 a.m. to 2 p.m.
- Holy Images Blessing As is our tradition, we will bless personal icons and other religious items on the First Sunday of the Great Fast, March 10, also known as the Sunday of Orthodoxy (True Worship), which marks the restoration of the icons to the churches on

March 11, 843, following the suppression of the Iconoclastic heresy.
